Jet Powered Gliders

This note should be read in conjunction with the existing BGGC Notes on use of Turbo Gliders.

The advent of gliders featuring Jet sustainer engines whilst featuring apparently simpler deployment/start-up procedures and reduced drag whilst deployed have been seen to introduce additional noise related concerns.

Whilst this may be a subjective view when compared to the existing noise generated by 2-stroke turbo equipped gliders it is hoped that pilots operating jets will ensure that if operated close to Nympsfield this only occurs above a reasonable height and that you do not loiter in the vicinity of the airfield e.g. avoid thermalling or running the ridges repeatably whilst the jet is running.
