

Risk assessment – Covid-19 and Two-Seat Instruction Activities

BASIC PRINCIPLES

Social Distancing – close proximity (<2m) should be minimised by doing things ALONE (if safe to do so) in the first instance. If assistance is required then social distancing protocols should be adhered to. If, in the unlikely situation of close proximity being required, suitable precautions e.g. face coverings should be used.

Hygiene – when handling equipment, contact should be minimised in the first instance – equipment required to be touched should be cleaned and sanitised before the first use of the day, at every crew change and then after the last use of the day with appropriate cleaning material e.g. disinfectant wipes. The regular washing of hands or application of hand sanitiser is encouraged.

Face Coverings – When working in close proximity to the cockpit (e.g. during the DI and during flight) face coverings should be worn.

Fresh Air Ventilation - During flight, the DV panels should be opened to maintained natural ventilation in line with the latest government guidance

Vulnerability Considerations – the vulnerability of the instructor and pupil is recognised. They must understand the risks and whether they can manage those to acceptable levels, if necessary additional mitigations need to be put in place. Remember no instructor is under a duty to instruct.

Consideration should be given to those that will be using the equipment after you.

Coronavirus Test or Symptoms – members should not come to the club if they have tested positive for coronavirus or had any symptoms within the last 10 days.

Inclement weather shelter arrangements— Occasional poor weather prompts members to require shelter from the elements e.g. a passing shower, in order to socially distance shelter should be sought;

- alone in their own vehicles.
- socially distanced in one of the open nearby hangers, or
- in the launch-point bus with numbers restricted to 6 wearing face coverings or just one member without a face covering..

Catching COVID-19 from two-seat operation	Activities include: -preparing the site and aircraft. Including removing gliders from hanger, preparing the gliders, e.g. batteries, parachutes, daily inspection, buggies	Instructor & pupil	Minimise the number of people involved in each operation. Ensure hands sanitised before handling equipment. Clean surfaces touched after manoeuvring the gliders from the hanger, this may include wing tips, the nose of fuselage, and cable release. When Dl'ing the K21, check that the dividing barrier, if installed, is secure and all barrier seals are in place. To maintain social distancing only one person should be on a buggy. Sanitise hands after handling equipment.	Instructors & pupils
	Pre-flight activities – including briefing, preparing cockpit, and access	Instructor & pupils	Briefings shall be conducted outside the launch-point bus. Ideally parachutes will be used by a single pupil on any individual day. Pilots shall cleanse with disinfectant wipes all items potentially touched by previous pilot including wiping the hard internal surfaces, canopy frame, controls, handles, instruments, DV panel, etc. To ensure social distancing during this activity it needs to be done in sequence	Instructor & pupils



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	Doot flight	Instructor 9	unless those involved are wearing face coverings. Care to be taken on entering the glider to preserve social distancing where possible. It is recommended that the front seat pilot enters the glider first. Face coverings should be worn in flight.	Instructor 9
	Post-flight activities including – egress from aircraft, retrieving aircraft and preparing aircraft for next pupil/crew and de-briefing	Instructor & pupils	Care to be taken on exiting the glider to preserve social distancing where possible. It is recommended that the rear occupant exits the glider first. After flight the pilots shall cleanse with disinfectant wipes all items potentially touched including wiping the hard internal surfaces, canopy frame, controls, handles, instruments etc. It is really important that you consider your fellow pilots. Debriefing shall take place outside e.g. outside the launch-point bus, chairs should be available. To maintain social distancing, access and use of the launch-point bus should be minimised where possible with a maximum of 6 provided they are wearing face coverings. Prior to entry to and on exiting the bus hands should be sanitised. All equipment touched shall be cleansed with disinfectant wipes.	Instructor & pupils



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	Putting equipment away	Instructor & pupils	At the end of use, all equipment likely to have been touched during the day should be wiped down with disinfectant wipes. This includes after returning to their overnight storage: - the launch-point bus controls, - glider handling points e.g. nose of fuselage, wing tip, cable release equipment removed from gliders e.g. batteries and parachute clips - buggy controls	Instructor & pupils

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	Pre-flight information	Trial flight pupils	To avoid having to sign paperwork, etc and reduce direct interaction with the office staff the office will provide the following via email in advance of a trial flight: - Indemnity Form, - Link to video briefing. It is anticipated that trial flight pupils will return these 'signed' electronically.	Office Staff

			Trial flight vouchers will normally have been mailed in advance.	
			In order to avoid social distancing issues, trial flight pupils must be able to get in and out of the gliders without assistance. This will be clarified by the office staff when arranging the flight. Trial Flight pupils must not attend if they feel unwell or display any coronavirus symptom within the previous 10 days. They should undergo a Covid-19 self-test within the 48 hours before their flight and must not attend the club if they received a positive coronavirus test result within the previous 10 days. Additionally the office will ensure that trial flight pupils are not in another vulnerable category (i.e. diabetic, asthmatic etc.) Two trial flight parachutes will be allocated to trial flights. These will be alternated between trial flight pupils hence reducing the number of people in
