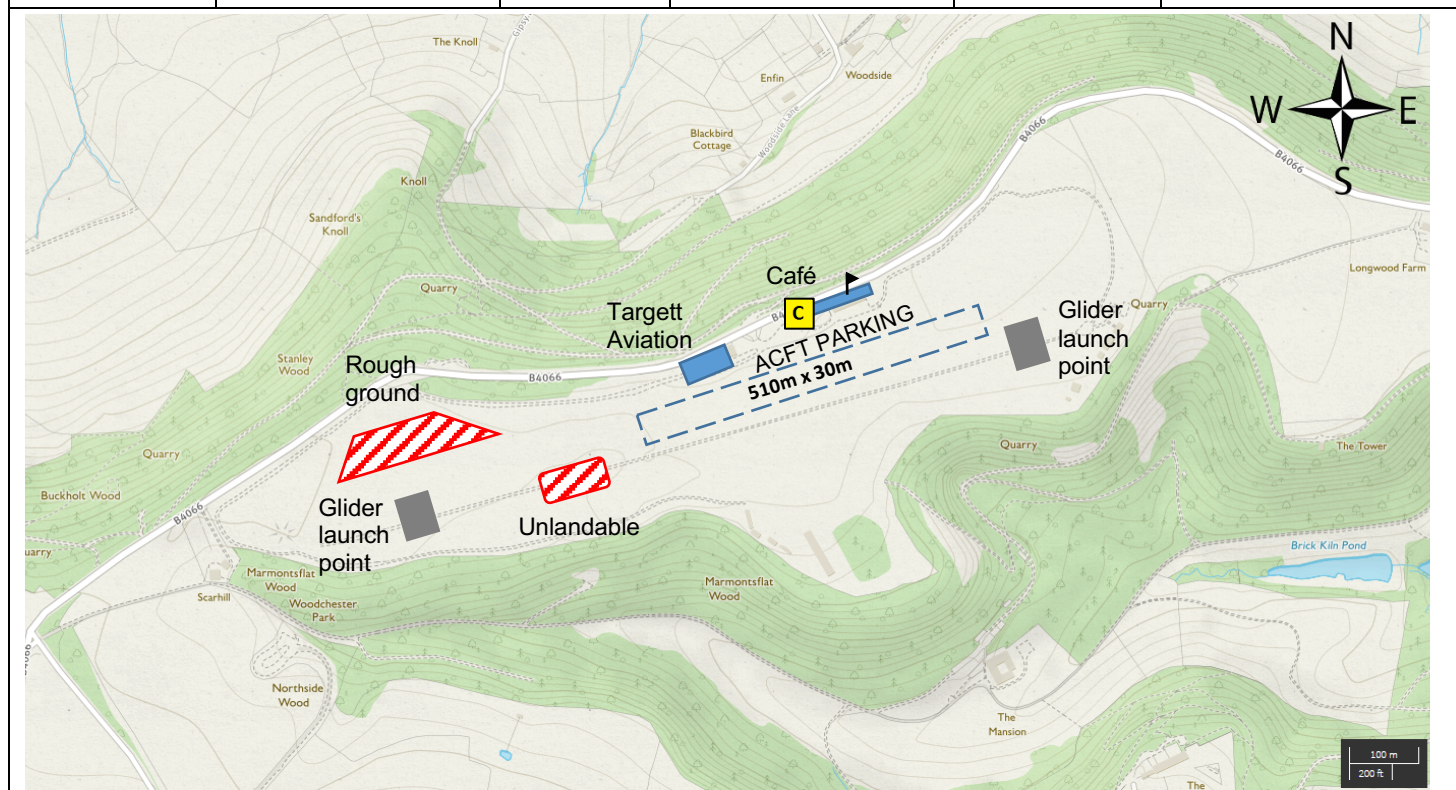

Information for Visiting Pilots

REMARKS	Arrival: Overhead joins prohibited. Do not overfly the airfield below 3000’ agl. Departure: Always taxi along the North perimeter to the launch point before commencing takeoff. Visting pilots MUST obtain a briefing from the Duty Instructor, or if not available read the Visiting Pilots information document before operating. Intensive gliding operations with winch and aerotow launching 7 days per week, powered aircraft or gliders may arrive or depart even if the field appears inactive. No dead side. Expect gliders to fly non-standard circuits and approaches. Power aircraft must give way to gliders and tug/glider combinations. Track running the length of the field is for the winch cable tow out vehicle and is not suitable for landing or taxiing. Winch cables may be present on the ground adjacent to the track. Power take offs and landings should be to the North of the track to avoid crossing cables. Make all turns to the left after landing and then taxi directly to the Northern boundary. Taxi along the Northern side of the airfield. Note - Airfield surface is undulating and rough in places & some areas not visible from the launch point – never taxi onto the airfield in a dip. 129.980 A/G Radio not always manned, blind calls are appreciated at 5NM, downwind, on final and for all ground movements. All power aircraft movements must be recorded in the Movement Book in clubhouse foyer.				
WARNINGS	Cables may be present up to 2000’ agl. Some wind directions, particularly 280°-010°, can cause severe and unpredictable wind shear.
